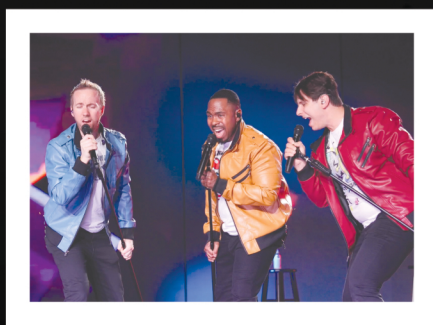


The Brothers Doobie - Monday, November 10, 2025
